

Client Bill of Rights

Consumers of services received by Psychologists, Marriage and Family Therapists, and Professional Clinical Counselors licensed by the state of Minnesota have the right:

- 1. To expect that the therapist has met the minimal qualifications of training and experience required by state law;
- 2. To examine public records maintained by the Board of Psychology, the Board of Marriage and Family Therapy, and the Board of Behavioral Health and Therapy which contain the credentials of a therapist;
- 3. To obtain a copy of the rules of conduct from the State Register and Public Documents Division of the Department of Administration, 117 University Avenue, St. Paul, MN 55155
- 4. To report complaints to the Board of Psychology 2829 University Avenue S.E., Ste. 320, Minneapolis, MN 55414, or the Board of Behavioral Health and Therapy, 2829 University Avenue S.E., Ste. 210, Minneapolis, MN 55414;
- 5. To be informed of the cost of professional services before receiving services;
- 6. To privacy as defined by rule and law;
- 7. To be free from being the subject of discrimination on the basis of race, religion, gender, or other unlawful category while receiving services;
- 8. To have access to their records as provided by Minnesota Statutes, section 144.335 subdivision 2;
- 9. To be free from exploitation for the benefit or advantage of the therapist; and
- 10. To refuse treatment at any time
